## **Grant Impact: Becoming Stewards of the Earth**

When asked about a story demonstrating the impact of this grant, one teacher shared "This may sound strange, but it was the dill! Through planting seeds and watching them grow, my students felt a sense of ownership and responsibility saying to one another 'we planted these Seeds.' Then, one day, a student noticed a caterpillar on the ground, which happened to be a swallowtail caterpillar who loves dill. Students were really excited and wanted to learn everything they could about this caterpillar. I watched as they built a connection with the world around them, develop empathy and become stewards of the earth."

## **Fostering Authentic Inquiry and Curiosity**

- An unexpected outcome of this grant
  was a focus on research and discovery,
  especially for our preschoolers.
  Through the garden, students began
  asking questions about the
  environment, about animals, and really
  latched on to experiential learning
  element of the garden.
- Students learned together, which became a gateway to researching more about what they were seeing. This opportunity would not have presented itself without the garden.
